



#### THE CATHERINE McAULEY LEARNING CENTRE

It was an honour and a privilege to deliver a speech at the Mass for our Opening and Blessing of the Catherine McAuley Learning Centre. During the speech, I spoke about our history and what we have accomplished over the years. Please find the transcript below.

Today marks a significant milestone in the journey of our school community as we gather to officially open eight new classrooms. These classrooms represent more than just physical spaces; they symbolise our unwavering commitment to providing the best possible learning environment for our students.

Next year, Holy Eucharist School celebrates 50 Years of Catholic Education. This morning, I would like to share with you some of our history to remind us all of where we have come from and where we are today.

Back in 1974, St Albans South was growing rapidly. Many new European migrants and young families began to settle here in St Albans South. There was now a need for a Catholic school in the area. In 1974, plans were drawn for Holy Eucharist school.

The Sisters of Mercy moved into the convent in O'Brien Drive to help with starting the school. Sr Leonie Glennen was appointed as the first principal. Sr Margaret Broadbent, Sr Margaret McHugh, and Sr Helen Duffy taught at the school when it opened in 1975. I am so grateful that they are here with us today to celebrate the opening of our new building.

The school continued to grow and flourish, and so did the buildings. In 1978 stage 2 of the school, which included a library, was completed. But it didn't stop there; a number of relocatable classrooms were needed to accommodate the growth.

(By the way, that's me in Grade 1, in the top right-hand corner...).








In 1979, the Sisters of Mercy moved to other parishes, and the Missionary Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus arrived at Holy Eucharist to work in the parish and at the school.





Over the years, Holy Eucharist School continued to grow, and many other principals and staff followed.





Since 2015, enrolments at Holy Eucharist School have grown from 372 students to 565 students and 75 staff in 2024. So back in January 2021, I wrote to our local MP, the Hon Ms Natalie Suleyman, and to the Minister of Education, who was the Hon Mr James Merlino at the time, asking them to support my application for our school to receive much-needed funding for a new building.

In August 2021, I received a phone call from Ms Suleyman with some good news. She rang to tell me that our school was successful in our application to receive \$2 Million from the third round, of the Non-Government Schools, Capital Grant fund.

This money, together with the school's contribution of \$2.7M which includes a bank loan, enabled us to build a new 2-storey building comprising of 8 classrooms, maker spaces, a teacher planning room, a new toilet block, a PE storage room, and a learning deck at a total cost of \$4.7M. I would like to thank Ms Natalie Suleyman for her support with our successful application and to the former education minister Mr James Merlino.



I would like to acknowledge the incredible professionalism and attention to detail of Ms Mel Walton and Ms Alex Leeder from MINX Architects as well as Mr Adam Whelan and Mr Andrew Munro from Gemcan Constructions. I would also like to thank Ms Yvonne Karneii from Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools for her guidance and support with the project.

Today, I acknowledge all those who were involved in the Holy Eucharist journey - many of you are here today. I would like to thank in particular the Sisters of Mercy for their contribution to Holy Eucharist School and parish.



Therefore, I have named the new building in honour of the Sisters of Mercy and have decided to call it the Catherine McAuley Learning Centre. Catherine McAuley dedicated her life to caring for the poor and started the religious congregation of the Sisters of Mercy.





#### **SEMESTER 1 REPORTS AND PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS**

Holy Eucharist School will be conducting Parent - Teacher Interviews in Term 3. The interviews will be held on <u>Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> July 2024</u> from 12:15pm until 7:00pm. Please note that <u>students</u> in P-2 will finish school at 11:55am and students in 3-6 will finish at 12pm on this day.

We regard Parent - Teacher Interviews and Assessment and Reporting as a vital part of our school program. On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June 2024, you will receive your child's formal report and Assessment Portfolio. The work samples inside the portfolio were collected in Term 1 and Term



2 as evidence of what has been taught during Semester 1. These samples support what has been documented in the term outlines and should be looked at in conjunction with your child's report, prior to the Parent – Teacher Interviews.

Parent - Teacher Interviews are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher about your child's progress. However, they are also a great way to discuss any concerns or questions you may have regarding your child. It is important that you take the time to think about the things you would like to discuss with your child's teacher, to ensure you make the most of your allocated time. The Parent - Teacher Interviews will be approximately **15 minutes in length** – just enough time for you and your child's teacher to meet and communicate. **Please be on time as we are unable to accommodate changes on the day.** Specialist and intervention teachers will also be available should you wish to discuss your child's progress.

Parents and carers will be given a letter about the Parent-Teacher Interviews next week. Parents/Carers will be able to nominate their time preference on the slip and will need to return this to their child's teacher without delay.

#### THE ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY (2023)

The Annual Report to the Community is a requirement by the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA) and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS). The purpose of the Annual Report to the Community is to inform parents and the wider school community of the school's successes, activities and achievements throughout the year and to meet legislative and regulatory requirements under the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 and the National Education Agreement 2008. Schools are required to submit this report annually to MACS. Once the report is approved by MACS and the Victorian Catholic Education Authority (VCEA) it is then published on the VRQA State Register.



The 2023 Annual Report to the Community is accessible on the school website and is available at the office.
