JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE 2025

Dear Holy Eucharist Community,

Pope Francis has declared 2025 as the Jubilee Year of Hope. A Jubilee is a sacred time of grace and spiritual renewal, marked by prayer, pilgrimage, and sacramental repentance. Traditionally observed every 25 years, a Jubilee may also be declared at other times at the Pope's discretion. Its purpose is to inspire holiness among the faithful and to strengthen the Church's mission in sharing God's boundless mercy with the world. In preparation for this special year, Pope Francis has introduced a prayer for the Jubilee of Hope and invites all the faithful to pray it throughout the year (please see above).

It is with sadness that I share the news of the passing of Fr John O'Reilly.

Fr O'Reilly served as the Parish Priest at Sacred Heart, St Albans, from 1973 to 2019. In the early 1970s, he supported Fr Anthony Guelen in establishing Holy Eucharist Parish.

A visionary leader in Catholic education, Fr O'Reilly played a key role in founding Catholic Regional College campuses in St Albans, Keilor Downs, Melton, and Sydenham, as well as Emmaus and Cana primary schools. His dedication extended beyond education, as he was also instrumental in establishing Mercy Hospice Care.

His legacy of faith, service, and commitment to Catholic education will be long remembered. May he Rest in Peace.

GATES CLOSE AT 8:55AM

All Prep to Year 6 classes begin at 8:55am. If your child <u>arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need</u> to enter via the Administration Gate, as all other gates will be locked. If your child arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office. Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the attendance roll and will appear on the student's report card each semester.

The whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who arrive late each day are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. When children are late, teachers have to repeat instructions again, which takes them away from teaching the rest of the class who are at school on time.

During our Parent/Teacher Chats, we were informed by parents/carers that **many of our students are going to bed very late at night.** As a result, the students are struggling to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. **Please remember, if your child is tired then they are going to find it difficult to learn!**

NAPLAN 2025

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Year 3 and Year 5 will commence on Wednesday 12th March 2025 and finishes on Monday 24th March 2025.

Schools have been asked to prioritise the tests within the first week of the testing window in order to accommodate students who may be absent from 12th - 24th March. These students will have the opportunity to complete the catch-up tests (for most subject areas) the following week.

NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy.

SCHOOL HATS IN TERM 1

There are a number of students at our school who do not have a school hat. In Australia we have "one of the highest rates of melanoma diagnoses in the world...two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the age of 70" (SunSmart, 2019). The good news is that almost all skin cancers are preventable. It is recommended that staff and students use a combination of sun protection measures (i.e. sun hat, sunscreen, clothing, shade and sunglasses when outdoors, avoid deliberate and extended sun exposure) when UV index levels are 3 or above (generally from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria). In Term 1 and Term 4 all students and teachers are required to wear a hat when they are outside. It is an expectation and school policy that all students wear their school hat and their correct school uniform at all times.
