IN LOVING MEMORY OF FR PETER FRANCIS CARRUCAN

(23rd February 1932 - 27th February 2025)

It is with sadness that I share the news of the passing of Fr Father Peter Carrucan, former Parish Priest. Father Peter arrived at Holy Eucharist Parish, St Albans South, in 1992 and served as the parish priest until 2010.

Fr Peter celebrated sacraments for students at Holy Eucharist School as well as those attending state schools. He also introduced the Liturgy of the Word for children at the 11 a.m. Sunday Masses, allowing primary school children to celebrate and reflect on the Gospel in an age-appropriate way.

In 1993, Fr Peter appointed John Steele as principal of Holy Eucharist Primary School. Together, they oversaw the school's refurbishment that same year, along with various building projects over the years. In 2006, the temporary classrooms at the back of the school were demolished and replaced with two new classrooms. The building was later named the "Peter Carrucan" Building.

During his time at Holy Eucharist, Fr Peter showed great compassion and care for those in need and those who were sick. He ministered to the sick at Sunshine Hospital, Grantham Green Nursing Home and Westside Lodge Aged Care. The parish motto, "We Welcome the Stranger," was developed during his time at Holy Eucharist.

In February 1996, Fr Peter asked parishioners and volunteers to assist him in setting up a food bank to support refugees arriving in Melbourne. The food bank provided them with a welcoming food parcel and helped them find temporary accommodation. Fr Peter lived out the parish motto diligently, feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, and comforting those who were grieving.

Always responding to calls for help, Fr Peter sought the support of every available service. He introduced a NILS (No Interest Loan Scheme), allowing refugees to borrow money without interest and repay it over time. With permission from the Archdiocese, he financed the purchase of a house to provide temporary accommodation for homeless families. He also appealed to parishioners for clothing, food, and other assistance to support newly arrived refugees in any way possible.

Even after retiring as Holy Eucharist's Parish priest in 2010, Fr Peter continued to "Welcome the Stranger". His passion for supporting those seeking refuge never wavered.

On the evening of Thursday 27th February 2025, Father Peter passed away peacefully at 93 years of age at St Joseph's Little Sisters of the Poor after a short illness. Fr Peter was a role model for our community, embodying the gospel values of respect and dignity. "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." (Matt 25:35-36). He will be deeply missed by many.

Rest in Peace Fr Peter.

REMINDER - GATES CLOSE AT 8:55AM

All Prep to Year 6 classes begin at 8:55am. If your child <u>arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate,</u> as all other gates will be locked. If your child arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office. Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the attendance roll and will appear on the student's report card each semester.

The whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who arrive late each day are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. When children are late, teachers have to repeat instructions again, which takes them away from teaching the rest of the class who are at school on time.

During our Parent/Teacher Chats, we were informed by parents/carers that many of our students are going to bed very late at night. As a result, the students are struggling to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. Please remember, if your child is tired then they are going to find it difficult to learn!



PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL PREMISES AND CHURCH GROUNDS
The driveway next to the church is a 'Kiss and Go' zone. This means that parents/carers cannot get out of the car to escort their children to gate/classroom. Students need to have their school bag ready next to them before leaving home, so that they can leave the car as soon as the driver has

stopped in the 'Kiss and Go' zone. Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- Do not leave your car unattended in the church driveway
- . Do not park your car in the staff parish carpark
- Do not block or park in neighbouring driveways
- Do not double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with **DISABLED** stickers are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays in the church carpark.
- Do not park on people's nature strips.

Brimbank Council have notified the school that parents are blocking Oleander and Chedgey Drive with their vehicle. Please remember that it is illegal to block the road with your car!

BREAKFAST CLUB

Holy Eucharist School, Breakfast Club will be operating in the new Catherine McAuley Learning Centre. Breakfast club will operate from Monday to Friday from 8.30am until 8.45am. Breakfast will be provided for all of our students who may not have had breakfast before coming to school. Breakfast consists of toast with butter and/or jam or vegemite. All students are welcome.













NAPLAN 2025

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) for Year 3 and Year 5 will commence on Wednesday 12th March 2025 and finishes on Monday 24th March 2025.

Schools have been asked to prioritise the tests within the first week of the testing window in order to accommodate students who may be absent from 12th - 24th March. These students will have the opportunity to complete the catch-up tests (for most subject areas) the following week.

NAPLAN is a nationwide measure through which parents, teachers, schools, education authorities, governments and the broader community can determine whether or not young Australians are developing the literacy and numeracy skills that provide the critical foundation for other learning and for their productive and rewarding participation in the community.

NAPLAN results allow parents/carers and educators to see how students are progressing in literacy and numeracy over time – individually, as part of their school community, and against national standards. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May.

NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four areas (or 'domains') of:

- Reading
- Writing
- Language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- Numeracy.

SCHOOL HATS IN TERM 1

There are a number of students at our school who do not have a school hat. In Australia we have "one of the highest rates of melanoma diagnoses in the world...two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the age of 70" (SunSmart, 2019). The good news is that almost all skin cancers are preventable. It is recommended that staff and students use a combination of sun protection measures (i.e. sun hat, sunscreen, clothing, shade and sunglasses when outdoors, avoid deliberate and extended sun exposure) when UV index levels are 3 or above (generally from mid-August to the end of April in Victoria). In Term 1 and Term 4 all students and teachers are required to wear a hat when they are outside. It is an expectation and school policy that all students wear their school hat and their correct school uniform at all times.


