⚠ A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (13:1-9)

Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.'

He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down.""

CHURCH DRIVEWAY

REMINDER

Last week, I received a phone call from Brimbank City Council regarding parents blocking Oleander and Chedgey Drive. The council has advised that this is illegal, as it is occurring due to parents/carers leaving their cars unattended in the church driveway. The parking inspector will issue fines to drivers who are not adhering to the road rules.

Unfortunately, if this issue continues, we will have no choice but to permanently close the church drop-off zone. This situation not only disrupts traffic flow but also poses a serious safety risk. In times of emergency, it is critical that ambulance and fire services can access the site without obstruction. Additionally, blocking these areas impacts the surrounding properties and residents.

At the end of last year, the Parish installed new parking spaces next to the drop-off zone for staff working in the Parish office. Please note that these spaces are reserved for Parish staff only and are not to be used by the school community.

We are working to make this drop-off zone as safe as possible for our students and the wider community. To assist with this, I have instructed our maintenance officer to help supervise the area during morning drop-off and at home time pick-up.

I kindly ask for your cooperation in adhering to these parking rules. If this issue persists, we will have no alternative but to close the driveway permanently.

Thank you for your attention and support in ensuring the safety of our school community.

PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL PREMISES AND CHURCH GROUNDS The driveway next to the church is a 'Kiss and Go' zone. This means that parents/carers cannot get out of the car to escort their children to

gate/classroom. Students need to have their school bag ready next to them

before leaving home, so that they can leave the car as soon as the driver has stopped in the 'Kiss and Go' zone. Please ensure that you adhere to the following road rules:

- Do not leave your car unattended in the church driveway
- Do not park your car in the staff parish carpark
- Do not block or park in neighbouring driveways
- Do not double park. Even if it is for a few seconds.
- Only those persons with DISABLED stickers are permitted to park in the disabled parking bays in the church carpark.
- Do not park on people's nature strips.

Brimbank Council have notified the school that parents are blocking Oleander and Chedgey Drive with their vehicle. Please remember that it is illegal to block the road with your car!

REMINDER - GATES CLOSE AT 8:55AM

All Prep to Year 6 classes begin at 8:55am. If your child arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need to enter via the Administration Gate, as all other gates will be locked. If your child arrives at school after 8:55am, they will need to obtain a late pass from the school office. Each time a student is issued with a late pass, it is recorded on the attendance roll and will appear on the student's report card each semester.

The whole school has a literacy block in the morning where students participate in intensive reading and writing activities. Students who arrive late each day are missing out on specific instructions for given tasks. When children are late, teachers have to repeat instructions again, which takes them away from teaching the rest of the class who are at school on time.

During our Parent/Teacher Chats, we were informed by parents/carers that many of our students are going to bed very late at night. As a result, the students are struggling to get out of bed in the morning and come to school feeling tired. Please remember, if your child is tired then they are going to find it difficult to learn!

FUNERAL – FATHER PETER CARRUCAN

Father Peter Carrucan, former Parish Priest of Holy Eucharist, passed away on 27th February 2025. His funeral was held at St John the Baptist Church in Clifton Hill on Tuesday 13th March 2025. The church and hall were at full capacity. This is a true testament to the profound impact Fr Peter had on many lives.



Natalie Suleyman MP spoke in parliament about Fr Peter's contributions to the local community. She also acknowledged the passing of Fr John O'Reilly, former parish priest at Sacred Heart, who passed away in February this year and was recognised for his significant contributions to the people St Albans.

"I rise today to honour Father Peter Carrucan, who passed away peacefully on Thursday 27 February 2025 at the age of 93. In 1996 Father Peter founded the Holy Eucharist Loaves and Fishes foodbank to assist those in need. This service continues to grow, feeding the most vulnerable in our community. I also would like to acknowledge the passing of Father John O'Reilly. Father John served as the parish priest for over 50 years at Sacred Heart in St Albans. The legacies of Father John and Father Peter live on, and we are grateful for their contributions to our community. May they rest in peace (Natalie Suleyman MP).

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS FOR 2025

Students eligible for CSEF in 2025 will receive the one off \$400 assistance to help cover costs of school uniforms (including black school shoes), textbooks, excursions and activities.

Parents/carers must provide the school with a valid receipt from PSW for school uniforms purchased in 2025. This also applies to black school shoes that are a part of the school uniform.

Please note, that this does not include runners. As soon as the school receives your valid receipt, the amount up to \$400 will be deducted from school fees.

Schools are not permitted to refund these amounts in cash.

Dear Parents and Carers.

Re: School Saving Bonus

In 2024, the Victorian Government announced its School Saving Bonus (SSB), which provides eligible families attending non-government schools with one-off \$400 assistance to help them cover the costs of school uniforms, textbooks, excursions and activities.

Only students receiving the means-tested <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u> in 2025 are eligible for this additional support.

I am writing to you because you are eligible to receive this Victorian Government cost-of-living relief. What is the School Saving Bonus (SSB)?

The School Saving Bonus is **not** a direct cash payment. It is applied to your school account to help you cover the costs of:

- Camps, excursions, and incursions
- Swimming and sporting programs
- Outdoor education activities
- Graduation costs
- School uniforms from approved uniform suppliers only (generic brands from retailers such as Kmart or Target are not eligible).
- Black School Shoes as per image

This does not include Runners

The SSB cannot be used for before/after school care, sacramental programs, or general classroom materials.

How does it work?

You won't receive a direct cash payment.

The \$400 SSB will be used to directly help cover the cost of camp levies and/or other activities listed above. For other approved expenses such as school uniforms, the amount will be credited to your family's account when you provide Holy Eucharist School with a valid tax receipt and, if you're an eligible recipient of the MACS Concessional Fee Policy, this will reduce the total Concessional Fee owed.

What do you need to do?

When purchasing uniforms, textbooks, or other eligible school items outlined above:

- 1. Ensure you obtain a tax receipt from the store where you have purchased eligible items.
- 2. Advise our school administration office which costs you'd like your SSB payment applied to from the list outlined above. Please note that we will prioritise claiming the highest value items/activities first.
- 3. Give the tax receipt for your eligible purchases to our school administration office. The amount will be applied to your family's account.

If you did not receive or keep a receipt at the time you purchased school uniforms that you wish to claim, contact the retailer and ask for a copy of your receipt.

We will process a credit to your school account based on the amount spent, up to \$400.

If you do not use the whole \$400 in 2025, it can be carried forward to the 2026 school year. If your child transfers to another MACS school, any unused funds will be transferred with them.
